

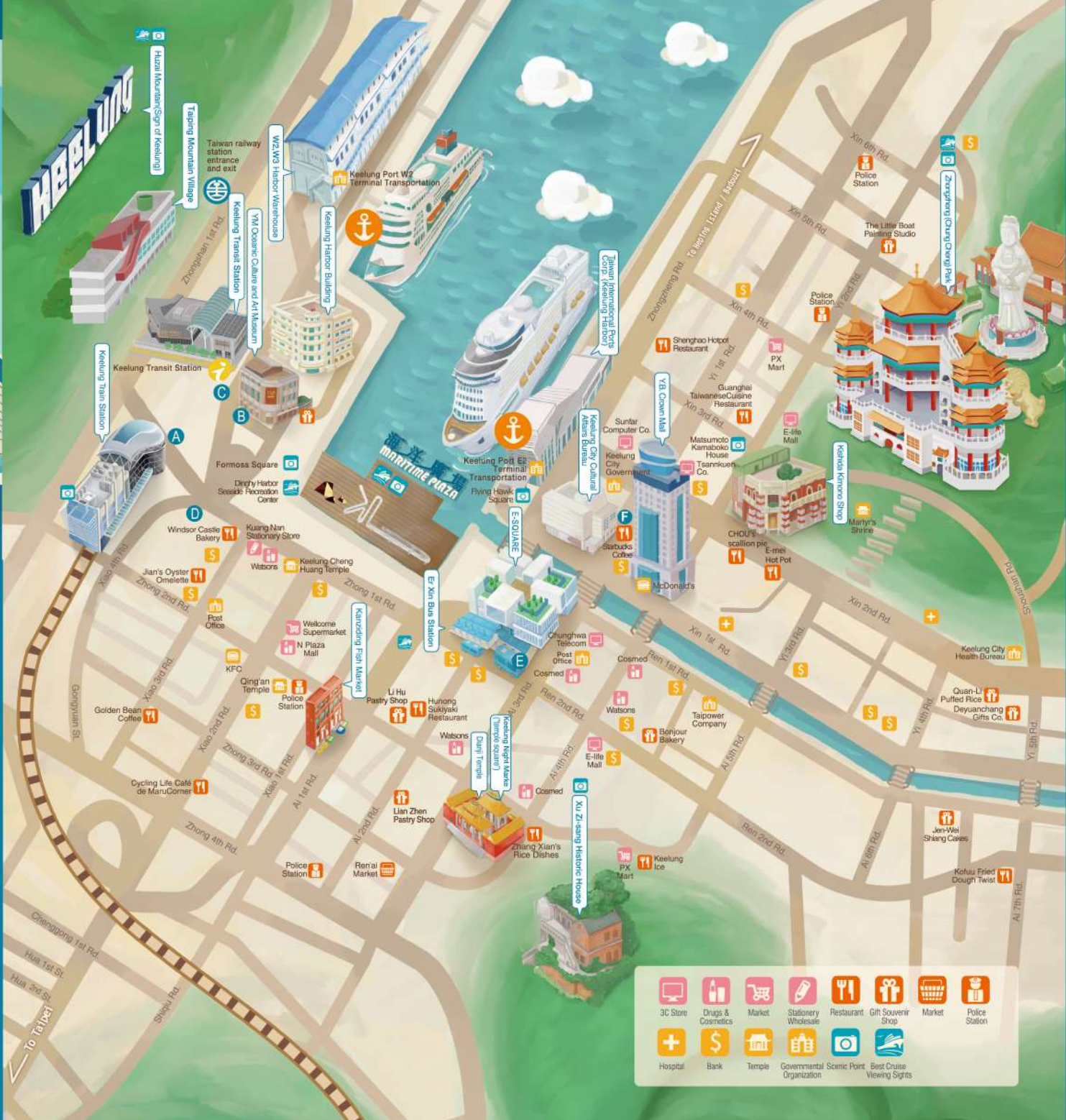

The City of Delicacies

Keelung's Miaokow ("temple square") offers a wide variety of delicacies and snacks which link the people to the land. Many locals of northern Taiwan consider the area as an extension of their kitchens. Come experience the beauty and history of Keelung through our fascinating array of food.

Tofu Pudding

Traditional tofu pudding is made with fresh soy beans. The pudding has a delicate and smooth texture and is often served with adzuki beans, mung beans, and white jelly fungi. The classic common dessert delivers rich and multi-layered flavors.



Braised Eel Soup

Chunks of eel are coated with red yeast rice and fried in hot oil, then they are slow cooked in a pot of Chinese cabbage. The soup is served with a bit of black vinegar on top. The soup is fresh and sweet, the fish tender and smooth. This is a very popular local snack.



Butter Crab

Crabs are wrapped into thin flat parcels with onions, butter, and a pinch of sauce then roasted on charcoal fire. You can smell the delicious aromas as they cook. It is impossible to resist the sweet scent of cooked crab with butter.



Sesame Sticky Rice Powder Balls

The filling - lard mixed with a small pinch of sesame powder and wetted with water - is placed in a large flat bamboo basket and rolled about in sticky rice powder. The ball gradually becomes bigger as it sticks on more rice powder. This is an essential dessert enjoyed during traditional festivals.

Ground meat is mixed with fish paste and molded into smooth nuggets, then cooked in a soup made with pork bones and vegetables and thickened with potato starch. This is a very popular dish among the public.

Braised Pork Knuckle

Pork knuckles are braised in special homemade sauce, which contains sticky gelatin from pig trotter tendons, until they are soft and flavorful. The knuckles, which are as famous as the ones from Wuliuan, Pingtung, are braised and sold daily. The braised pork rice bowl is delicious, too.

Dianji Temple

Dianji Temple, which has more than 140 years of history, is a temple of Kaohsiung Shengsiang, a major deity of Qing Dynasty immigrants from Zhangzhou. The temple doors are decorated with sea moll carving (sea shells and crabs) showing that most Keelung locals used to work as fishermen to earn a living. This temple is not only a centre of worship, but also the point of origin of local culture and delicious Miaokow snacks.



Potside Rice Sticker Soup / Ding bian cuo

A rice dish which originated from Fuzhou, the small sheets of rice noodles are made by steaming and roasting rice batter on the edge of a large pan. The rice noodle sheets are then dried, cut into small pieces and cooked in a soup to make ding bian cuo. In Taiwan, the soup is made with ingredients such as local seafood, mushrooms, bamboo shoots, and dried shrimp. Chinese chives and fried shallots are used to enhance the flavor of this delicate soup.

Sandwiches

Flour, yeast, butter, salt and other ingredients are kneaded into an oval-shaped dough then fried until it's golden. Silt open the bread and put in ham, braised egg and mayonnaise. This type of sandwich is popular among the younger generation.



Tempura

To make tempura, strips of striped cutfish and/or sea set, potato starch, sugar and miso are mixed into a batter, molded and fried directly at the stall. Tempura fresh from the fryer smells wonderful and are best enjoyed hot.

The working overhead cranes show how busy this commercial port is. Hidden in the alleys, Kazanding Fish Market displays the spirit of the locals as fishermen hawk their goods. Take a walk around the port and enjoy the seaside view. Welcome to Keelung, the harbor city.

Large ships slowly entering the natural waterway. Clusters of containers lay around the harbor and people busy replenishing supplies of cargo ships from around the world. These are just a few common scenes at this busy international trading harbor. This harbor is also where a navy command center is situated and where fishermen return to with their catch.

Qing'an Temple

ADD: No.1, Zhong 3rd Rd., Ren'ai Dist., Keelung City



Qing'an Temple, known as the Mazu Temple in Keelung, is a must-visit spot for visitors. There are three Mazus (from Meizhou, Quanzhou and Zhangzhou, respectively) worshipped jointly in this temple, which symbolizes the peace agreement made between the settlers that came from the three respective areas.

E SQUARE

ADD: No.226, Hai 2nd Rd., Ren'ai District, Keelung City



E SQUARE, a shopping center in Keelung City, offers a diverse range of international cuisines and family-friendly facilities. On the rooftop, visitors can enjoy a green public space with a 200-meter open-air sea-view PU running track. With scenic views of the harbor, cruise ships, eagles, and the beautiful Keelung Port, this running track is perfect for strolls or morning jogs.

Keelung Cheng Huang Temple

ADD: No.7, Zhong 1st Rd., Ren'ai Dist., Keelung City



The temple was built on land donated by local scholars. Cheng Huang Temple, Dianji Temple and Qing'an Temple are known as the three main temples of Keelung.

Keelung Harbor Building

ADD: No.5, Gangsi St., Ren'ai Dist., Keelung City



Built during the Japanese Occupation Period, this building was the first general office building in Taiwan. As the harbor transformed into a modern port, all harbor area related businesses were centralized and processed here.

Xu Zi-sang Historic House

ADD: No.15, Ln. 2, A 4th Rd., Ren'ai Dist., Keelung City



The old house belonged to Mr. Xu Zi-sang, District Officer of Keelung area during the Japanese Occupation Period. The official name of the house is "Qingyu Hall". The building displays a combination of Minnan and Baroque style architectural elements. After climbing up the stairs to the house, visitors can take in the grand view of Keelung Bay.

Originally the Nippon Yusen Kaisha (NYK) Office during the Japanese Occupation Period, the repurposed building preserved the elegant arches which were typical of the architecture trends of that time. The permanent exhibition located on the first floor has a simulated console of a five-ton cargo ship. Visitors can sample the experience of working at Keelung harbor and try their hand at loading cargo and departing from the harbor.

Kishida Kimono Shop Mita Bakery

This shop was once the most famous kimono shop on the street during the Japanese Occupation Period. Many fashionable ladies and gents satisfied their sartorial needs here. This is also the filming location for the movie A City of Sadness. The building has been renovated and is standing proof of the past prosperity of this area.

Zhongzheng (Chung Cheng) Park

ADD: No.300, Xn 2nd Rd., Zhongsheng Dist., Keelung City



From the highest point downwards, Zhongzheng Park can be divided into three zones. The large Guan Yin statue on the top of the hill is the quantity of fishermen and sailors. The middle area is where annual rites and rituals, including the Water Lantern Processions, for the Ghost Festival are held. The lowest area is a recreation space for locals to play and exercise.

Waimushan Coastal Scenic Area

Escape to the serene beauty of the Waimushan Coastal Scenic Area, where a stunning bay, white sandy beaches, and crystal-clear blue waters meet the rich history of a charming fishing village. Visitors can immerse themselves in various beach activities, savor the freshest seafood delicacies, or stroll along nearby trails with breathtaking views of Keelung Island and passing cruise ships.

Ershawan Fort / Haimen Tianxian

ADD: Shouyuan Road, Zhongsheng District, Keelung City



This Qing Dynasty Chinese style battery, also known as the "Tenable Gate of the Sea", was a crucial defense point during the 19th century. This battery is listed as a Level One National Historical Site.

Heping Island

ADD: No.202, Ping 1st Rd., Zhongsheng Dist., Keelung City



The island closest to Taiwan, Heping Island is where westerners first set foot on in this region. The island is also part of the northern military-controlled zone. Formerly known as Sheliuo Island, this was an important place for Han settlers. The unique rocks on the island are formed by wind and waves, and offer a wonderful outdoor education environment for the public to learn about marine abrasion landforms.

National Museum of Marine Science & Technology

Located right next to Badouzi Fish Harbor the museum offers various types of exhibitions and an IMAX theatre. We hope that these different experiences can inspire more people to explore our rich and diverse marine ecology.

Zhengbin Visitor Center

The recipient of the 2022 National Excellent Construction Award's Gold Medal for Best Planning and Design, the building boasts a sleek white curved design that evokes the image of the wind gliding over the ocean and creating gentle ripples. As a regional tourism service integration center, it offers comprehensive travel and tourism information and services, fostering sustainable tourism and driving the circular economy.

Zhengbin Fishing Harbor Colorful Houses

Shawan History & Culture Park

Explore the Banasy shell heap sites from several centuries ago, remnants of the Sino-French War, and the Japanese-era seaweeder baths.
